- Project title

- A brief abstract/project description (250–300 words).

Where applicable, abstracts should include:

- Objective
- Design
- Setting
- Participants
- Intervention (if applicable)
- Main outcome measures and scientific merit.
- Results/findings
- Conclusion
- Relevance to primary care & impact on patient care

Please list all authors, including the presenting resident.



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Important Dates

- **Submission Deadline:** September 18, 2026
- **Notification of Selected Applicants:** September 30, 2026
- **Conference Dates:** November 24–27, 2026
- **Final Formatted Poster Submission Deadline:** November 3, 2026

Poster Presentation Details

- Up to 3 submissions will be selected by the Conference Organizing Committee.
- Selection will be based on relevance to primary care, scientific merit, originality, and potential impact on patient care.
- Posters will be displayed electronically on the conference foyer screen and within the conference app.
- Formatting requirements will be provided to selected applicants.
- Selected residents will be offered complimentary registration for one conference day to present and discuss their posters with attendees during the conference session and lunch breaks.
- Final poster files/materials must be submitted by **November 3, 2026**, for review and production planning.

Selected presenters must disclose any financial relationships, funding, grants, in-kind support, or affiliations that could influence poster content. Posters must be educational and free of promotional or marketing material. Company logos, advertisements, pricing, and purchase solicitations are not permitted. Use generic terms whenever possible and minimize trade names.

The SPH CME CONFERENCE Organizing Committee reserves the right to request revisions to ensure compliance with the above stated requirements.
